MORGANTOWN -- Bill Karbonit made a breathtaking drive-in layup with only five seconds showing on the clock to give the undefeated Flying Eagles of Woodrow Wilson High School an "impossible" 71-69 come-from-behind victory over Weirton for the state Class AAA basketball championship here Saturday night.


Mountaineer Field House was jampacked with 6,500 fans for the
