


The National Merit Scholarship Program affords hundreds of high school students, who have outstanding scholastic abilities, an opportunity to obtain a college education. Merit scholarships are awarded on academic and personal merit, without reference to financial

need. Individual stipends are, however, determined on the basis of actual need and range from \$100 to \$1,500 per year for tuition, fees, and living expenses. Most Merit Scholarships include a "cost-of-education" grant-in-aid to the colleges selected by Merit Scholars.



The citizenship girl is honored each year by the D. A. R. while the citizenship boy is honored by the Civitans.


