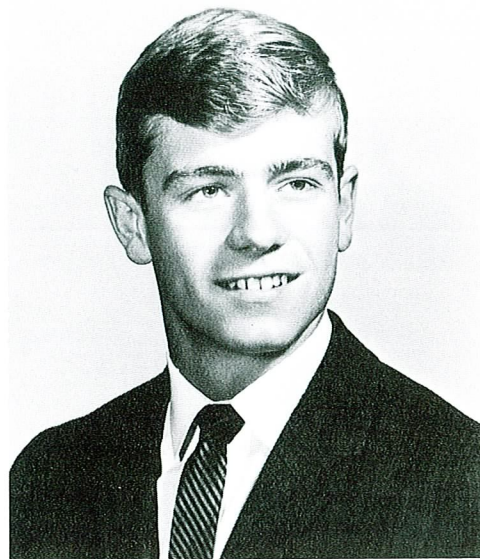

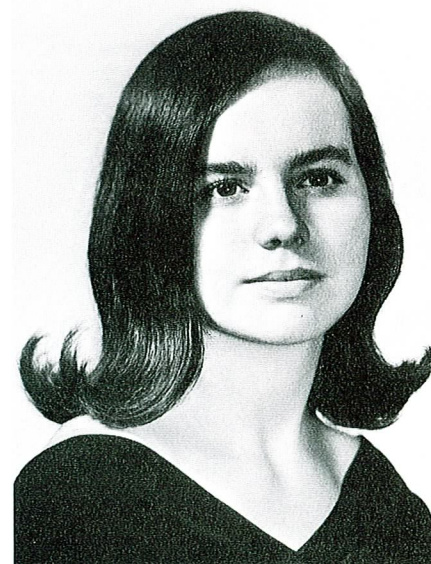

## *National Merit Finalists*

The National Merit Scholarship Program affords hundreds of high school students, who have outstanding scholastic abilities, an opportunity to obtain a college education. Merit scholarships are awarded on academic and personal merit, without reference to financial

need. Individual stipends are, however, determined on the basis of actual need and range from \$100 to \$1,500 per year for tuition, fees, and living expenses. Most Merit Scholarships include a "cost-of-education" grant-in-aid to the colleges selected by Merit Scholars.

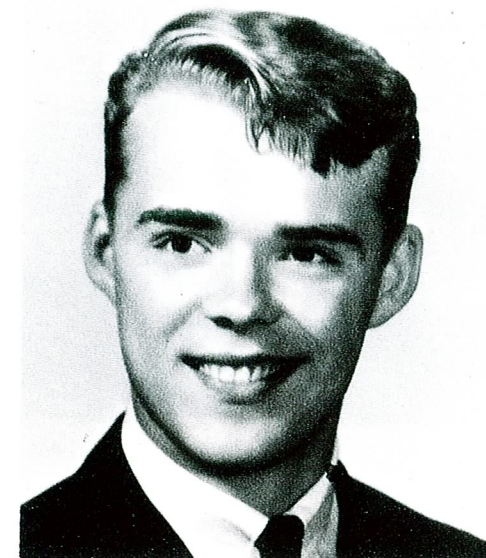

lish. Before being allowed to come to this country, he had to fill out an application and write a 200 word composition on why he wanted to come to America.

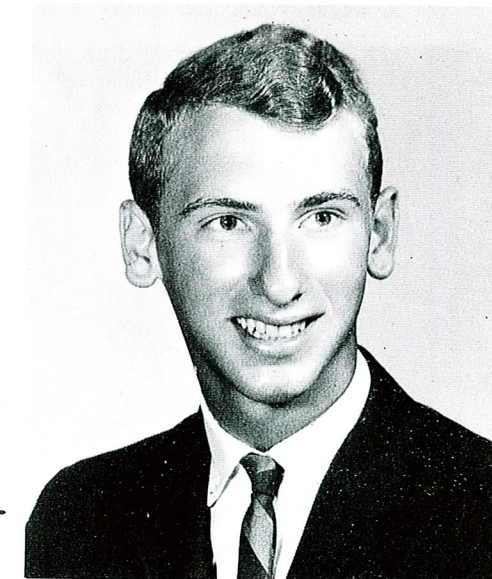
Now that he is here, Ricard enjoys pool, skiing, dancing, and American television which he finds quite educational as well as enjoyable.
